Connecting Corridors Community Planting May 13 – Little Road

The Biodiversity Fund grant received by Kuranda Envirocare in 2012 has allowed the team to take on 10Ha of serious riparian rainforest revegetation. We have opened up areas all along the Barron river, so its now possible to walk along the river from Mantaka/Russett Park bridge to Little Road at Warril Creek.

The area from Little Road crossing to a lovely stand of remnant rainforest trees near the rapids, upstream from the Little road crossing is a case in point. Once a mass of guinea grass, prone to fire every few years, it's now a nice walk along the river flats under river cherries, melaluecas and other hardy river trees.

The birds have been returning as shown in field survey work by a small team of volunteers over 3 years, led by Dr. Ray Pierce and reported on the Envirocare website by Dr. Pam Shultz, funded by a Birdlife Australia grant. Resultant ideas to improve revegetation have been incorporated in the most recent planting year. We have rediscoverd three massive fig trees near Owen Creek and opened that area around them up, once a coffee plantation, the rainforest understorey had been taken over by small coffee seedlings.

Our nursery volunteers took advantage of the masses of seeds last year to build up a collection of natives which are more than we need as our project winds down. So we're having a plant sale. We have trees whose lineage stretches back to Gondwana

land, shrubs and trees which attract the birds, ones for butterflies, sets of hibiscus, some which are best for screening and, of course, the cassowary food trees. Some are best for revegetation and others are good and small enough for gardens.
