Syzygium oleosum Blue Lillypilly MYRTACEAE



Typical height: 10m Spread:

Climate: Tropical to temperate.

Light conditions: Full sun, part shade

Growth habit: A small fast-growing tree. Flower and fruiting times may be irregular, and on occasion profuse.

Growing conditions: Occurs in North East Queensland, Central East Queensland, and as far south as the coastal areas of central New South Wales at altitude 0-1,320m in rainforest, wet sclerophyll forest, and open forest. Adaptable to a variety of sites and soils where moisture is ensured.

Flowers: Nov – Aug. Fragrant. **Fruit:** Anytime throughout the year. Purple. Edible.
